

**Guidelines for Entry to
the Salvation Army Adult Rehabilitation Center**

Requirements to enter program:

- Open to Men, Ages: 21 – 60
- Social Security card, Photo ID, TB Test Result (in hand)
- No Income (All services are provided free of charge)
- No outstanding warrants
- No Felony Convictions for: Violent Crimes, Sex Crimes, or Arson (A background check will be done prior to admission.)
- Certain mental conditions may exclude an applicant. Each applicant will be screened at the time of application.
- Must be able to work and be in good enough physical condition to stand on their feet for 40 hours and be able to lift up to 50lbs on a regular basis.
- Only doctor prescribed medications are allowed and must be checked in at the time of admission. Each applicant should have a 30-day supply before admission. Medications that will result in a positive UA test may not be used at any time. (The beneficiary should check with their doctor for medication advice prior to admission.)

The Salvation Army Adult Rehabilitation Program is a 6-month spiritual program that includes work therapy. Every new beneficiary will be on a 30-day restriction that does not allow them to leave the center and no visitors are allowed during this period. Cell phones may not be used until the beneficiary completes the 4th month. No appointments or court cases can be held within the first 30 days, since the beneficiary cannot leave the center. (If a court hearing is scheduled, it will be up to the beneficiary's attorney or representative to have the hearing postponed.)

After 30 days, the beneficiary is allowed to leave the center following work assignments and evening classes and must return by curfew. Prior to re-entry, each beneficiary is tested using a breathalyzer. Regular and random drug tests are conducted for every beneficiary.

After the third week, a pre-approved family member or significant other may attend the Sunday morning church service with the beneficiary.

These guidelines are not all inclusive and each case is considered independently. The Salvation Army Adult Rehabilitation Center reserves the right to deny admission to any applicant at its sole discretion.
